





## The legend of Józef Piłsudski



"Józef Piłsudski. The First Marshal of Poland, the leader of the nation and the father of our homeland, Honorary Citizen of the City of Kraków" – this is how Piłsudski was described in the posters informing the public of the details of his funeral. The Commander-in-Chief of Polish Armed Forces died on 12 May 1935 in Warsaw. He was a Polish independence activist, politician, and an outstanding military commander. Later on he became the Chief of State of the Republic of Poland and two times Prime Minister of Poland.

His death was announced to the people of Kraków by the tolling of Sigismund Bell at Wawel Cathedral and dozens of other bells in all of the city's churches. The body of the dead statesman travelled from Warsaw to Kraków by train. The ceremonial burial took place on 18 May. The city was decorated with black and white and red flags and banners. Hundreds of thousands of mourners walked in the funeral procession from the Main
